This IDYLLIC country Finca has virtually no track.

Entering the property through a sweeping drive bordered trees, there is plenty of parking space.

To the rear of the property there is a large private swimming pool with integrated Jacuzzi.

The property itself is bright and spacious. You walking into an open-plan living room and kitchen separated by a breakfast bar.

This space has the added benefit of high-ceilings, give the illusion of even more space.

There are also three good-sized bedrooms and a family bathroom.

This charming property is a real hideaway, while still being a 5 minute drive from the village.

Pizarra is a charming, small village located along the local railway line between Málaga and Alora.

The village has many restaurants and bars where you can enjoy local food, drinks and a typical Andalusian night out. The village also has an interesting Municipal Museum, which was created to exhibit the collection of the famous American painter Gino Hollander, who lived in the area for many years.

20 km North of Pizarra, you find El Chorro and the famous 'El Caminito del Rey'. This is a walkway pinned along the steep walls of a narrow cliff. It used to be the most dangerous walkway of the world, but after years of extensive repairs and renovations it is now one of the most popular tourist attractions of the area.

Pizarra is only a 30 minutes (35 km.) drive from Málaga, the airport and the beaches of the Costa del Sol and offers the best of both worlds.
